10 countries out of 127 cities are managed by women, which is 7.9%	15 countries have laws which do not allow women to take on responsibility in their countries
12.2% of over 2 million local and regional leaders are women, representing 6.1%	
10.5% of women are in the world. The figure was 12.4 in 2012. The highest increase was in Thailand with 17.4% of women.

RABAT DECLARATION

We, mayors and representatives of towns, cities, local and regional governments the world over, from small, medium-sized and large towns and cities, from metropolitan areas and regions, at the service of rural and urban communities, come together from the 1st to the 4th October 2013 in Rabat, the Kingdom of Morocco, on the occasion of the 4th World Congress of United Cities and Local Governments:

REAFFIRMING the importance of the opinion of the urban communities in the contribution to local democracy and the strengthening of their authorities on the global scene, in particular through its decisive role along with the United Nations Organisation and Agencies in the foundation of UCLG in 2004;

REAFFIRMING that the founding values of peace, dialogue and understanding among peoples and languages between local authorities are as relevant today as ever;

ACKNOWLEDGING that already in all its dimensions it is an asset for society and a source of development;

CONSIDERING its role, small, medium and large towns, cities, local and regional authorities, throughout the world and in the progress on the planet and population (starting from the effects of climate change, food resources, and of housing, security, culture, education) and social inclusion that encourages our efforts to imagine the future and build democracy;

REITERATING its resolve to which the global cities continue to refer to as an example in an urban context and to which, although not at the origin of the crisis, local authorities in many regions, in particular in Europe, are directly facing the consequences of a crisis that has a direct effect on the status of the present to their citizens, employees and housing, leading them into a state of economic and social emergency;

RECOGNISING the need to enter into with all members of local authorities and organisations, in particular with the urban citizens and their family organisations, to promote peace in the world and to define an international agenda that will help overcome the current situation in which half of humanity cannot benefit from the economic living standards;

REITERATING that Municipal International Cooperation and International Cooperation, gathering international local government agencies, today cities 1000, and mutual assistance through capacity-building programmes and international municipal authority institutions are a vital contribution to the construction of a peaceful and sustainable development world;

REITERATING the irreplaceable positive role of local authorities, in particular, in the process of peace and dialogue among peoples and related relations;

Adopted in Mexico City, 20 November 2010

We have met here in Mexico City at a time when local and regional governments across the world face severe challenges and crises. Nonetheless we have a clear responsibility to look ahead and create the conditions for a better future for all.

Our future is not only globally intertwined, but increasingly urban. In the next 20 years Africa and Asia will see by far the fastest growth in urban settlements. In Africa alone, the growth in population will equal the current entire population of the USA.

It is the world's medium and smaller towns and cities, far more than the largest cities, which will be responsible for receiving and looking after these millions of new urban dwellers. Moreover, as the world's urban population grows, the interdependence of towns and countryside become even tighter.

We know of course that the challenges facing city leaders differ from region to region, from country to country, and that those in low-income countries face stresses and problems on a vastly greater scale. But we share many common goals as well as problems, and are united in a common determination to make our urban world a better, more inclusive world. Here, therefore, is our Manifesto for the City of 2030.
